Exposure to COVID-19 in School and to wider school	School Staff/ Teachers/ Parents/ Visitors to School	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Encourage handwashing with all children at key points in the day (Before and after break and lunch, at the start and end of the day.) Hand sanitiser to be used as an alternative. Children and staff encouraged to use a tissue or elbow to cough or sneeze and use bins for tissue waste ('catch it, bin it, kill it') First aid kits and inhalers to be kept in classrooms to avoid unnecessary visits to medical room. The school is kept sterile by the cleaners, and objects and surfaces frequently touched are cleaned on a regular basis. Doors to be propped open to avoid children having to touch handles bearing in mind fire safety and safeguarding. Windows to be open in every room during the day to ensure good air flow. (including all shared areas) Children wear PE UNIFORM on PE days to avoid changing close together and allow for more time outside CO2 monitors used across the school to assess air flow (if currently working) If someone displays symptoms of COVID whilst onsite (continuous cough, temp, lack of smell/taste, they will go home and follow the Government guidance on staying at home https://www.gov.uk/guidance/people-with-symptoms-of-a-respiratory-infection-including-covid-19#children-and-young-people-aged-18-years-and-under-who-have-symptoms-of-a-respiratory-infection-including-covid-19) Where a pupil becomes unwell and is waiting for collection, they will be moved to the medical room or next to a window in a well ventilated area If a child or member of staff tests positive for covid, they need to self-isolate and follow government guidelines https://www.gov.uk/guidance/people-with-symptoms-of-a-respiratory-infection-including-covid-19#children-and-young-people-aged-18-years-and-under-who-have-symptoms-of-a-respiratory-infection-including-covid-19 If the member of staff isolating is well enough, they will zoom into their class (where appropriate) During drop off and pick up, large gates are opened and pupils dropped off and dismissed at class doors. Individual instruments assigned in music lessons and if shared, instruments are wiped down and disinfected. Staff are given the choice to wear masks if they wish to. If cases rise, the following measures could be put in place – masks for adults in communal areas, school split into Key Stage bubbles, singing stopped in whole school assemblies, visitors to the school restricted 	1	3	3

LIKELIHOOD
 1- Highly unlikely **LOW**
 Unlikely to happen or very infrequently
 2- Unlikely **MEDIUM**
 Could happen on a less regular basis
 3-Likely **HIGH**
 Will almost certainly happen on a regular basis

CONSEQUENCE
 1- Minor **LOW**
 Cuts, bruises, requires first aid treatment
 2- Major **MEDIUM**
 Broken bone, hospitalisation, &/or up to 3 days absence
 3- Serious **HIGH**
 Death, major injury, results in over 3 days absence

Risk = Likelihood x Consequences
Overall Risk
Score: 6 & 9 = High, urgent action required
Score: 3 & 4 = Medium, action to an agreed timetable
Score: 1 & 2 = Low, or tolerable risk no action may be required
