### Vision - Government

## Swimming at George Grenville Academy

Children across KS2 participate in swimming lessons for one term in Year 3, one term in Year 4 and half a term in Year 5 and 6. These lessons take place at the local swimming pool, The Swan Pool, and are led by trained swimming coaches. There are also two members of staff at Grenville who are trained. Below are the swimming figures for Year 6 (2017/2018)

Meeting national curriculum requirements for swimming and water safety	Impact

## Impact Analysis

Over 50% are reaching their target but planning needs to be adapted to ensure this percentage rises rapidly.

Of the 29 children in the cohort, 55% were new during KS2 and did not complete the full programme of swimming lessons offered by the school.
