This week has been our science week and the children have all had lots of exciting science activities to investigate.

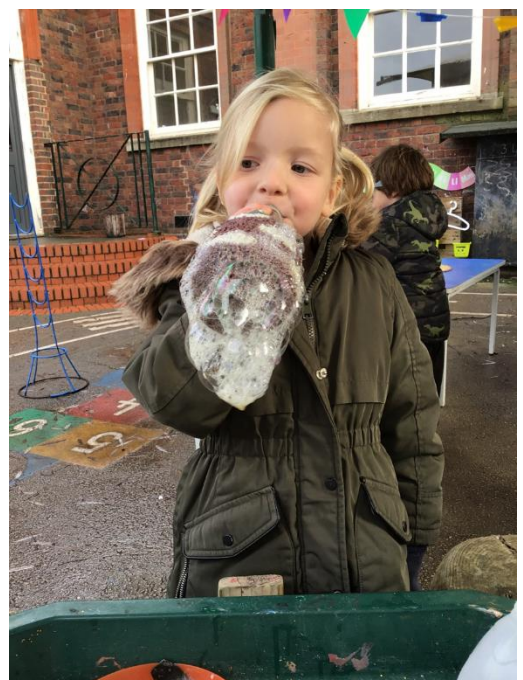
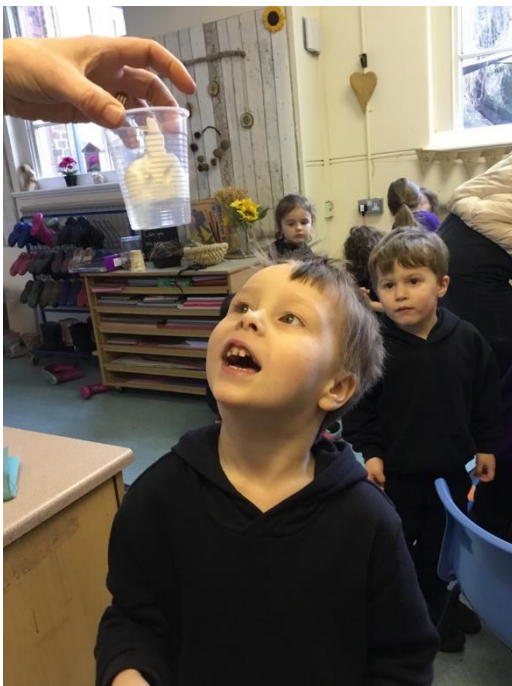
Nursery

We have really enjoyed starting 2023 with a bang by exploring volcanoes and the reaction between vinegar and bicarbonate of soda in creating a lava like substance



Reception

Reception have been making boats and rainbows. They have also been experimenting with making rain – all ready for Noah's Ark!



Year 1

We have been asking lots of questions this week like – “Does toast always land butter-side up?”, “What makes raisins dance?” and “Does the type of drink make a difference to how much carbon dioxide is produced?”



Year 2

Year 2 have experimented with density, tested a myth that you can make a water rainbow with just sugar and food colouring and accepted the challenge of making dice float on water.



Year 3

Year 3 have been testing different liquids to find out which best stop apples from turning brown through oxidation. They also made natron salt form salt and baking soda and mummified peeled apples to try to preserve them. They added acids to milk to create casein - a plastic-like substance that they moulded into jewellery. They also used this process to make cheese - which they tasted with fruit and honey!



Year 4

On Wednesday, Year 4 learnt all about craters on the moon and how they are formed. On Thursday, they had to fix an astronaut's glove and plan a test to see if it was fixed. On Friday, we built our own rocket.



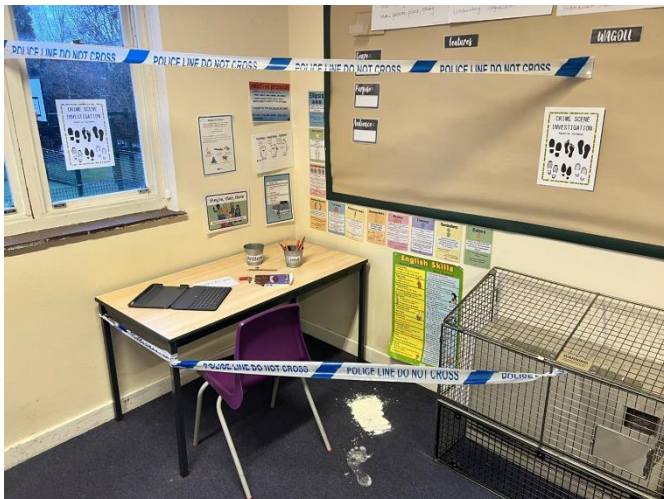
Year 5
