LAMDA (London Academy of Music and Dramatic Art) exams are designed to develop your life skills, such as clear communication, self-confidence and teamwork, through the creative platforms of drama, literature and music. All exams offer the opportunity to improve self-expression, strengthen memory and, most importantly, have fun.

Once a child is a high enough grade, LAMDA exams count towards that all-important UCAS points total. Not only that, the qualifications can give your child extra confidence in their university interview and future university career.

We are also so pleased to hear that some of our ex-Grenville pupils, who started in the after-school club a few years ago, have gone on to achieve these all-important grades. Well done!

### <u>Year 1</u>

Year 1 have been reading the Gruffalo this week. They have been acting out the story and drawing maps. Their rainbow challenge has involved writing about themselves, sorting objects and a self-portrait.



### <u>Year 2</u>

This week, year 2 have been reviewing colour theory in Art by mixing secondary colours.



### <u>Year 3</u>

This week, Year 3 have been working hard to create a clay cartouche. They had to roll out the clay and cut a slab. Then learnt how to add a coil and finally they carved hieroglyphics into it.



### <u>Year 4</u>

Year 4 had fun applying their knowledge of place value to the outside world. They first had to create a place value grid with sticks and then make a number using leaves and stones, instead of place value counters. They then looked at each place value chart to read the number created.

Year 5 have begun their forces work in science by investigating whether heavier objects fall faster than lighter objects.

Year 6 have been busy with their Secondary Transfer Test this week, but have still managed to enjoy the nice weather during P.E. This half term, they are learning netball skills and this week they were focusing on catching and throwing.
