



Moving up to Secondary School

For parents applying for a
Year 7 school place for September 2022

Introduction

This leaflet gives you some information about your child's move to secondary school. It also tells you how to apply for their secondary school place.

Buckinghamshire has upper/all-ability schools and grammar schools. Most children will sit the Secondary Transfer Test. The result of this decides which sort of school is suitable for your child.

You will make your application for a secondary school to the Local Authority (LA) in whose area you live. If you live in Buckinghamshire you will be able to list up to six schools located in any area on your application. All LAs share preference information with each other, where necessary.

Secondary Transfer Test

Children who go to a Buckinghamshire LA primary school will be able to take the Secondary Transfer Test. You must let your child's headteacher know if you do not want your child to take the test. Think whether a grammar school would be suitable for your child.

You should already have spoken to your child's headteacher if you think your child might not be able to access the Secondary Transfer Test. This might be because they have a disability or Special Educational Needs.

Make sure you speak to your child's headteacher if they are not in the normal year group for their age.

In July of Year 5 children will receive a Familiarisation booklet posted to their home address.

The Practice Test will take place in the autumn term of Year 6.

The timeline in this leaflet gives the dates for the Practice and Secondary Transfer tests. We will let you know your child's Secondary Transfer Test results on 15 October 2021. If your child does not qualify by scoring 121 or more, we will let you know what your options are.

We only consider qualified children for a place in a grammar school.

What to do first

Visit schools' websites to see how they will be hosting open events to learn more about the school. Look into your nearest and catchment schools, even if you are not sure they would meet your child's needs.

How are places allocated?

Sometimes schools have more applications than there are places available. In this situation we use admission rules to decide those children we should offer a place to. Information about admission rules is available from 'Find my child a school place.' You should check admission rules as different schools can have different rules. If you want to apply for a school in another area you should check their admission rules.

Some schools also have a supplementary form for you to fill in if you are listing it on your application. Check the School Directory available on 'Find my child a school place.'

Some schools give priority to low income families where children are in receipt of free school meals and/or pupil premium. It is important you check if your preferred school has this rule as you may need to provide evidence direct to the school.

We use distance in the admission rules to help us work out which children to offer a place to. All Buckinghamshire schools use straight line distance.

Buckinghamshire LA operates an Equal Preference scheme. This means that the preference number you have given each school (1st - 6th) does not affect how likely it is that your child will get a place. If, during the allocation process, we can offer your child more than one school, we offer the place at the school listed higher on your application.

You should list the schools on your application in the order you would like them.

How to apply

- Buckinghamshire residents only

You can apply online using a laptop, desktop, smart phone or tablet. Our system is safe and easy to use. Set up a username (your email address) and password. You can then fill in your child's details and list up to six secondary school preferences.

Apply online from 7 September 2021 at [buckinghamshire.gov.uk](https://www.buckinghamshire.gov.uk)

Once we have received your preferences, we will send an automatic email to confirm which schools you have applied for.

You can log back in to change your application at any time before the deadline.

You can apply online from a library if you don't have a computer at home. You might be able to use a computer at your child's current school. If you cannot apply online, you must let your child's school know and they will give you a paper form.

Make sure you apply by the deadline of 31 October 2021.

We ask you to provide us with evidence of where you live when you apply. See the website for a list of documents that you can choose from.

If you apply online, you will know which school we have offered your child a day early. You can log on to your account on 1 March 2022 to check the offer. You will also get this information in an email.

If you apply with a paper form, we will email you a letter on 1 March 2022.

School Transport

We provide free school transport to eligible secondary school pupils in Years 7 - 11. To be eligible for free school transport your child must:

1. Attend their nearest suitable school. The nearest suitable school is determined at the point school places are allocated.
2. The nearest suitable school must be over the statutory walking distance of 3 miles.

We measure by road when deciding which is your child's nearest suitable school.

For your child to be considered for free school transport you must include your child's nearest school as a preference on your application. It does not have to be the highest preference. If your child's nearest school is not listed as a preference on your application, then we will not consider providing free transport to a school further away.

We do not provide transport to your catchment school, unless it is also the nearest suitable school. For grammar qualified children an upper/all-ability school may be their nearest suitable school.

To be clear, transport is not provided to a child's nearest grammar school if it is not the nearest suitable school as this is a matter of parental choice.

If you have an older child already attending your preferred school who gets free school transport, you must not assume that your secondary transfer child will also get free school transport.

Check if your child would get free transport to your preferred school. From 7 September our online Transport Checker will be ready for use for 2022 applications.

Also, make sure you are familiar with the School Transport Policy which is published on the Buckinghamshire Council website.

If help with school transport is important to you, you need to think about this when making your secondary school application. Think also about how your child will get to school if they are not entitled to free school transport.

The 'Find my child a school place' service - enter your child's date of birth and postcode to:

- Find schools near to your address
- Check your child's entitlement to free school transport. This may influence your secondary school preferences and their order
- Apply for your child's secondary school place - from 7 September

There is also a School Directory which gives details of our secondary schools.

Allocation statistics will help you understand what has happened in previous years.

Timeline

You need to know about these important dates if you live in Buckinghamshire.

From June to October 2021

Learn about schools in Buckinghamshire using the School Directory in the 'Find my child a school place' service on our website. Visit schools' websites too.

From 7 September 2021

Make your application online at buckinghamshire.gov.uk from this date.

7 and 9 September 2021

Children attending Buckinghamshire primary and Partner schools take the Practice Test followed by the Transfer Test

Children attending out county schools may be tested on an alternate date still to be confirmed, please see our website closer to the time

15 October 2021

Secondary Transfer Test results released.

31 October 2021

Apply online by midnight on this date

1 March 2022

We offer secondary school places.
Parents who applied online will receive an email and can
also log on to check which school has been offered.
We post offer letters where necessary.
