
Samuel Pepys

Reasons Fire Spread Quickly in London

- The weather was hot and it hadn't rained for months.
- Houses in London were mainly built from wood and straw which is flammable
- The houses were very close together, so fire could easily spread.
- Strong winds were blowing
- There weren't fire engines and fire equipment was not much use.
- King Charles II did not act quickly enough



King Charles II

King Charles II was the King of England in 1666. After the fire he said that houses must be built further apart and build from stone not wood



The Great Fire of Buckingham

- 1725 (59 years later)
- Most of Castle Street and parts of Market Hill, West Street and Well Street were ablaze
- The fire destroyed 138 houses and left over a third of Buckingham homeless.
- The fire explains why, apart from the Chantry Chapel, there are no really old buildings in the centre of Buckingham.





he fire starts at Thomas Farriner bakery on Pudding lane.

Sunday evening



Houses are pulled down in an attempt to stop the fire spreading.

Early Monday morning



People carry their possessions to safety using boats on the River Thames.

Monday evening



The fire spreads very close to the Tower of London.

Tuesday



St Paul's Cathedral is destroyed by the fire.

Wednesda



The fire starts to burn more slowly as the wind dies down.

Thursday



The fire is finally under control and put out.
