Egypt is in the Northeast of Africa and links Africa to the Middle East.

Cairo is the capital city of Egypt. Other major cities are Alexandria and Giza.

Currency is the Egyptian Pound

Average rainfall (south of Cairo) is between 2-5 mm, during the winter months

Due to the arid climate of Egypt, most civilisation is concentrated along the river Nile and Nile Delta.

Egypt is one of the sunniest and driest countries in the world.

Most of Egypt is desert.

Egypt has a Mediterranean climate in the north, and desert climate further south.

Mediterranean temperatures:

Winter 10 – 20°C, summer 35°C

Desert temperatures:

Winter 20°C, summer 40 - 50°C

The Aswan Dam was built to control flooding, irrigation and generate hydroelectricity.

The longest river in the world, the River Nile runs through Egypt.

The population of Egypt is 102 million. Most people live along the River Nile.

Some of Egypt's main exports are natural gas, cotton products (clothing and sheets), citrus fruits, ceramics, cement and steel.

Egypt also relies heavily on tourism to their country..
