Europe is a continent, consisting of 50 countries.

Europe is bounded by the Ural Mountains in Russia, Arctic Ocean, Atlantic Ocean and Mediterranean Sea.

Europe as a continent should not be confused with the EU (European Union).

There are 3 main climates in Europe: polar, temperate and Mediterranean

The 6 main biomes are: Tundra, coniferous forest, deciduous forest, Mediterranean, alpine and temperate grassland.

The EU consists of 27 countries that work together, sharing the same goals and values. Each country elects a member of the EU parliament to make rules and laws that make life equal and better for those countries. Most share the same currency, the Euro, and allow EU members to travel freely between borders.
