This half term we will be exploring Victorian music of the people, including The Music Hall and music that everyday folk would have heard.

Start by having a look at this information from the Victoria and Albert Museum in London, all about the history of The Music Hall. It has some really interesting photos, posters and drawings, and a great slide show including some of the types of acts that were popular at the time.
